

CONTEXTE

2020 marquera les 50^e, 33^e et 25^e anniversaires de la célébration du Mois de l'Histoire des Noirs, respectivement aux États-Unis, au Royaume-Uni et au Canada.

2020 marquera les esprits au mois de février car c'est la première année durant laquelle cet événement se déroulera sur le continent africain avec l'implication de la société civile, des associations, des acteurs culturels et économiques, des chercheurs, des historiens et des autorités.

Nous, organisateurs considérons que faire connaître l'histoire des noirs aux autres peuples à travers le monde c'est bien, mais qu'il est temps que nous-mêmes apprenions notre histoire et que nous soyons fiers de ce que nous sommes pour l'humanité et pour le monde.

La décolonisation mentale passe par la réappropriation de toute la richesse identitaire des peuples noirs. La valorisation et la promotion du patrimoine culturel africain sont des actions qui commencent avec la conscientisation des nôtres pour mieux la diffuser au reste du monde.

Black History Month Africa est le nom choisi par les organisateurs pour cette commémoration d'envergure qui se déroulera du 1^{er} au 29 février de chaque année, sous le regard bienveillant et la bénédiction des bâtisseurs de l'Afrique du monde visible et invisible.

BLACK HISTORY MONTH AFRICA

CONTEXT

2020 will mark the 50th, the 33rd and the 25th anniversaries of the Black History Month in the United States, the United Kingdom and Canada, respectively.

2020 will mark the spirits in February because it will be the first year during which this event will take place in the African continent with the involvement of civil society, associations, cultural and economic actors, researchers, historians and authorities.

We, as organizers, consider raising people's awareness about black history around the world, but it is also time for us to learn our history and be proud of who we are as humans.

Mental decolonization involves taking back all the identity wealth of black people. Valorization and promotion of African cultural heritage are actions that begin with our awareness to better disseminate it to the rest of the world.

Black History Month Africa is the name chosen by the organizers for this major commemoration, which will take place from February 1st to 29th each year, under the benevolent gaze and blessing of the world's visible and invisible African builders.



Cette commémoration Black History Month Africa / Mois de l'Histoire des Noirs en Afrique qui se déroulera dans 10 pays d'Afrique, du 1er au 29 février 2020, propose un regard sur le "Mois de l'histoire des Noirs" vu et vécu par des africains du continent, avec la contribution des afro descendants de la Caraïbe ; et non pas avec un regard de "noirs américains".

Nous disons qu'il s'agit d'une première sur le continent africain, car la grande majorité des populations des pays francophones d'Afrique et même certains pays anglophones du continent n'étaient pas au courant de cette commémoration, encore moins l'organiser. L'ONG Africa Mondo à l'origine de cet événement international associe les associations, la société civile, les entrepreneurs, les universités, les chercheurs et les autorités au Mois de l'histoire des Noirs en Afrique, afin que le plus grand nombre puisse y être associé.

Nous avons d'innombrables personnalités africaines du continent qui ont des citations, des œuvres et des actions qui ont contribué à bâtir le continent africain. Notre jeunesse doit connaître notre histoire pour savoir où elle va !

En cette Décennie Internationale des personnes d'ascendance africaine, 2015 - 2024, déclarée par l'ONU, le Mois de l'histoire des Noirs AFRIQUE se matérialise pour que les africains racontent eux-mêmes leur histoire qui est celle de l'humanité.

L'histoire des africains n'a pas débuté avec l'esclavage ou le colonialisme, mais avec des Rois et des Reines Africains. Voilà toute l'histoire du Continent africain que nous voulons faire connaître aux jeunes et même aux ainés.

Bien-sûr, nous remercions Carter Woodson d'avoir initié d'abord "la semaine nègre" en février 1926 aux États-Unis... et le leader des Black United Students de la Kent State Université pour son expansion en "Mois de l'histoire des noirs" en février 1970. Reconnu officiellement par le gouvernement américain en 1976. Rappelons que l'objectif initial de ladite manifestation était de coordonner l'enseignement des Noirs américains dans les écoles publiques.

Mais, c'est fort de cet héritage, que nous constatons tous qu'en Afrique, tout comme aux Antilles, notre histoire a toujours été clairsemée, dépouillée et vidée de sa substance et est encore très mal enseignée voire pas du tout dans les manuels scolaires.

Africa Mondo étant très active dans l'organisation du Mois de l'histoire des Noirs à Québec au Canada, s'est sentie investie de cette mission qui est celle de porter cette commémoration sur le continent africain, compte tenu de ses objectifs. Ainsi, nous proposons en Afrique, pour la première fois, avec la bienveillance de nos ainés, un "regard africain et afro caribéen" du "Mois de l'histoire des noirs" pour célébrer l'histoire des africains du Continent et de la diaspora afro caribéenne.

#BlackHistoryMonthAfrica #BHMA est tout, sauf un "spectacle" ! C'est une commémoration hautement symbolique qui a un sens prononcé dans notre histoire et qui va influer sur notre avenir commun.

This Black History Month Africa commemoration, which will take place in 10 African countries, from February 1st to 29th, 2020, offers a glance at "Black History Month" seen and lived by Africans on the continent, with the contribution of Afro-descendants of the Caribbean ; and not with a look of "black Americans".

We say that this is a first on the African continent, because the vast majority of populations of the francophone countries Africa and even some English-Speaking countries the continent were not aware of this commemoration let alone to organize it. The NGO Africa Mondo at the origin of this international event brings together associations, the civil society, the entrepreneurs, universities, the Researchers and authorities in Black History Month in Africa, so that as many people as possible can to be associated.

We have countless African personalities from the continent who have quotes, works and actions that have helped to build the African continent. Our youth must know our story to know where it is going!

In this International Decade of People of African Descent 2015-2024, declared by the UN, the Black History Month AFRICA is materialized so that Africans themselves tell their story which is that of humanity.

The history of Africans did not begin with slavery or colonialism, but with African Kings and queens. This is the whole history of the African continent that we want to make known to young people and even seniors.

Of course, we thank Carter Woodson for being the initiator of the "Negro Week" in February 1926 in the United States ... and the leader of the Black United Students at Kent State University for his its expansion into "The month of The Black story" in February 1970. and officially recognized by the United States Government in 1976. It is worth recalling that the original purpose of the event was to coordinate the teaching of black Americans in public schools.

It is strong of this heritage, that we all observe that in Africa, just in the West Indies or Antilles, our history has always been sparse, stripped and emptied of its substance and is still very badly or not at all in the school manuals.

Africa Mondo is very active in the organization of Black History Month in Quebec City (Canada) and has invested in this mission to bring this commemoration the African continent, given its objectives. Thus, we propose in Africa, for the first time, with the benevolence of our elders in "African and Afro-Caribbean look of" on "Black History Month" to celebrate the history of Africans of the continent and the Diaspora Afro Caribbean.

#BlackHistoryMonthAfrica #BHMA is anything but a "show"! It is a highly symbolic commemoration that has a strong meaning in our history and will affect our common future.

QUI PORTE L'INITIATIVE ?

Dans le cadre de l'organisation pour la première fois en Afrique de la commémoration du Mois de l'Histoire des Noirs prévue en février 2020, à l'initiative de l'organisation canadienne et béninoise Africa Mondo, des personnalités de la société civile décident de créer la Fédération Internationale des Tables Rondes du Mois de l'Histoire des Noirs.

Cette entité fédère les Tables Rondes (associations à but non lucratif) de tous les pays participants à la première édition du Mois de l'Histoire des Noirs en Afrique, en février 2020, ainsi que toute personne morale ou physique qui souhaite prendre part aux activités du Mois, pour promouvoir les activités relatives à l'histoire des communautés noires, des personnes d'ascendance africaine et plus largement, le continent africain.

WHO CARRIES THE PROJECT?

INTRODUCTION OF THE FEDERATION OF ROUND TABLES

As part of the organization of the commemoration of the Black History Month in Africa for the first time planned in February 2020, at the initiative of the Canadian and Beninese organization Africa Mondo, personalities of civil society decide to create the International Federation of Round Tables of the Black History Month.

This entity brings together the Round Tables (non-profit associations) of all participating countries to the first edition of the Black History Month in Africa, in February 2020. It also includes any natural or legal person who wishes to take part in the activities of the Month as well, to promote activities related to the history of black communities, people of African descent and more broadly, the African continent.

MISSION OF THE FEDERATION AND ROUND TABLES

- Federate every moral and physical person around the Black History Month;
- Produce educational tools;
- Disseminate information on populations of African descent and Africa in general;
- Promote events and activities that take place during the Black History Month;
- Assist and support organizations, individuals and institutions that want to become involved in the Black History Month's activities and fight against racism, xenophobia and hate in one way or another;
- Develop a framework and structure that promotes social actors working on issues, challenges and issues affecting Black communities, at the social, economic, cultural and educational levels, while respecting the spirit of the Black History Month;
- Carry out a specific program for the Black History Month that highlights the social, economic, cultural, educational and institutional issues that affect Black communities around the world.

Why organize Black History Month in Africa?

When this initiative was born in the United States, President Gerald Ford called on Americans "*to seize the opportunity to honor the successes too often neglected of black Americans in all areas throughout our history.*"

In Africa now, starting from this year 2020, 50 years after the first edition of Black History Month in the United States, we, women, mothers and girls, are urging the African nations and all Afro-descendants of the Black Continent to celebrate, recognize, honor, value and promote all its children in a strong way; that is, the governments of African states, like in the United States, Canada, and the United Kingdom before, recognize and place this event on their agenda as a lighthouse.

The past is the past, and we cannot change it, but the future belongs to us, and it is up to us to make it wonderful. We have an indispensable duty to remember and recall history as every self-respecting nation, but the Black History Month celebrated in Africa must be a key event to weave the bonds of hope so as to move forward on all economic, ecological, solidarity, social, cultural, scientific levels.

It is in no way about self-flogging by taking up old discourses that divide us such as "*the Negroes have sold their brothers.*" The Guadeloupean that I am and the generation to which I belong wish that Black History Month in Africa be the witness of our reconciliation to build the present and build the future on bases that go far beyond slavery, to which we are perpetually attached. This is why, this first edition immediately fits, in the present, to draw the economic and solidarity contours of the contribution of the black continent in the world economy for the years to come.

The first countries on the African continent to make history through this event, will allow all afro descendants around the world to be powerful symbols that will now open all possible paths.

BLACK HISTORY MONTH ORIGIN

Black History Month is an annual observance originating in the United States, where it is also known as African-American History Month. It has received official recognition from governments in the United States and Canada, and more recently has been observed unofficially in the United Kingdom. It began as a way for remembering important people and events in the history of the African descendants. It is celebrated in February in the United States and Canada, while in the United Kingdom it is observed in October. The precursor event to Black History Month was created in 1926 in the United States, when historian Carter G. Woodson and the Association for the Study of Negro Life and History announced the second week of February to be the "Negro History Week". This week was chosen because it coincided with the birthday of Abraham Lincoln on February 12th and Frederick Douglass on February 14th, both of which dates black communities had celebrated together since the late 19th century. Negro History Week was the center of the equation. The thought-process behind the week was never recorded, but scholars acknowledge two reasons for its birth: recognition and importance. Woodson felt deeply that at least one week would allow for the general movement to become something annually celebrated. Also, after the ten years long haul to successfully complete his "Journal of Negro History", he realized the subject deserved to resonate with a greater audience.

United States: Black History Month (1970)

Black History Month was first proposed by black educators and the Black United Students at Kent State University in February 1969. The first celebration of Black History Month took place at Kent State one year later, from January 2, 1970 – February 28, 1970.

Six years later, Black History Month was being celebrated all across the country in educational institutions, centers of Black culture and community centers, both great and small, when President Gerald Ford recognized Black History Month, during the celebration of the United States Bicentennial. He urged Americans to "seize the opportunity to honor the too-often neglected accomplishments of black Americans in every area of endeavor throughout our history".

United Kingdom (1987)

Black History Month was first celebrated in the United Kingdom in 1987. It was organized through the leadership of Ghanaian analyst Akyaba Addai-Sebo, who had served as a coordinator of special projects for the Greater London Council (GLC) and created a collaboration to get it underway. It was first celebrated in London.

Canada (1995)

In 1995, after a motion by politician Jean Augustine, representing the riding of Etobicoke—Lakeshore in Ontario, Canada's House of Commons officially recognized February as Black History Month and honored Black Canadians. In 2008, Senator Donald Oliver moved to have the Senate officially recognize Black History Month, which was unanimously approved.
